It's Baaack: The 2017 **Great American Insurance** Group/USDF **Region 3 Dressage Championships**

South Florida will once again play host to the **Great American** Insurance Group/USDF Region 3 Dressage Championships Licensed by the USEF Oct. 5-8 at the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center (PBIEC). As a qualifier for the 2017 US Dressage Finals presented by Adequan, the Regional Championships are the gateway to Kentucky in November.

We've been lucky enough to host the Regional Championships when Wellington Classic Dressage put on the 2009 competition at the Jim Brandon Equestrian Center and again in 2014 at the Adequan Global Dressage complex, and this year will be the first the competition will be organized by Equestrian Sport Productions (ESP) at the PBIEC venue. permanent stalls, a variety of vendors and food options, trailer parking and a myriad of arenas and rings, the location is prime for the influx for serious dressage competitors.

Show Manager Monica Fitzgerald, who was also the show secretary for the 2009 and 2014 shows, is busy juggling all the pieces that make up a first-class show.

"I know that the upper level classes and the freestyles will be in the International Arena as well as the awards ceremonies." she said, adding that she is trying to keep all the rings close to the stabling but it's all dependent on the availability of warm-up arenas and the number of entries for the show.





"It's an ideal space," she said. "They are trying really hard to make it as successful at PBIEC for dressage competitors as it is for jumping competitors, and I think they are right on track. The way regionals are running nowadays, you just have to expect 300 plus horses."

To welcome that many serious competitors to the area, the Gold Coast Dressage Association will sponsor a Welcome Party on the first day of the show, Thursday, Oct. 5. Be watching for more information on the where and when.

Gold Coast will also feature a Rider's Lounge every day during the competition. Come relax with your fellow competitors in comfortable seating while enjoying a snack, a cold drink and some free giveaways.

Not only can you grab the glory, but the regional competition features more than \$20,000 in prize money from the USDF. But, as the saying goes, you can't win if you don't enter. Qualifying scores must be received by Sept. 11.

The first two upcoming shows can help you earn qualifying scores for 2017 and, although the second show's results will be recorded for 2018, it will be the ideal chance for you to show at the Palm Beach International Equestrian Center show grounds. You can get the lay of the land, figure out how long it takes to get to the warm-up arena from the barn, where to park your trailer, and suss out your favorite place to grab a bite to eat. Then, you and your horse will be cool, calm and collected when Regional Championships roll around just two weeks later.



We'll Miss You, Ed Borresen



Ed Borresen, a fixture in the South Florida dressage world and a long-time member of the Gold Coast Dressage Association who supported our shows for many years, died at the age of 62 in June. A dressage competitor and trainer as well as a fourth generation builder and stone mason, Ed was also well-known for designing and constructing equestrian estates.

As a equestrian, Ed trained at least eight horses to the Grand Prix level and competed horses for their owners. His mission, alongside his wife Monica Sink, was to train and develop dressage horses and riders from beginning to Grand Prix Levels and they believed in a deep understanding of the whole horse to create a happy partnership.


